This is the text of the motion, with the amendment.

Whereas, the Park & Recreation Commission has full and sole jurisdiction of Cricket Field, and

Whereas, Cricket is a vital asset of the Park & Recreation Commission and the Town of Needham and is heavily utilized by school and youth athletes and the Park & Recreation Department, and

Whereas, the field is located in a neighborhood that is short on green space and has historic significance to the neighborhood and town, and

Whereas, the current Hillside School site has not been thoroughly reviewed as to whether it can or cannot continue as a school site, and

Whereas, the building of a school at Cricket would result in substantial redistricting; would incur significant costs that would not be reimbursed by the State for the construction of replacement fields and field house and would result in the loss of two heavily utilized multipurpose fields, play ground and field house during the 4 years of construction, and

Whereas, three options have already been withdrawn by the School Committee,

I move that we request the School Committee and PPBC withdraw Cricket Field as an option for any school building development.

Superintendent's Comments

Superintendent's Comments

The Superintendent's commentary period included an announcement that Needham's students and teachers begin their summer vacations today after a very successful school year.

The Superintendent welcomed, Coach Drew Lawrence and the Needham High School Boys Tennis Team. The Superintendent read a statement from Needham High School Athletic Director, Micah Hauben which highlighted the second year in a row that the Rockets faced St. John's HS (Shrewsbury) in the Division I State Final, and the second time, Needham came away with the Division I State Championship. Dr. Gutekanst also pointed out that the team and Coach Drew Lawrence has been awarded the prestigious MIAA Sportsmanship Award.

Coach Drew Lawrence expressed his appreciation for the boy's tennis team adding that they are a wonderful group of young men who love the sport of tennis and who have worked hard for one another. Coach Lawrence stated that this group of young men has set a precedence that will help the team in the coming years.

The School Committee expressed accolades to the boy's tennis team for their hard work and achievements, also expressing that it is an honor to celebrate Coach Lawrence and the Needham High School Boys Tennis Team.

Public Comments

Public Comments

The Chairman, Heidi Black offered the opportunity for the public to speak to the School Committee on issues not on the agenda.

The Chairman recognized Hillside Ave resident, Susan Owen. Ms. Owen expressed that she is a member of a group organized around studying the School Committee and PPBC's proposal for putting a school on Cricket Field. Ms. Owen stated that her group has reached the conclusion that this is a bad idea. Ms. Owen stated that keeping Cricket Field in the proposal as an option is a disservice to the town, and takes away from finding a better solution to the Hillside and Mitchell problem. Ms. Owen thanked the School Committee for the opportunity to speak and expressed her appreciation for the fine and difficult work that the School Committee and Superintendent engage in.

The Chairman recognized Nehoiden Street resident, Elizabeth Bloom and Bobsled Drive resident, Joanna Herrera. Ms. Bloom stated that it is too early in the process to take any options off the table and that it is best that everything be preserved as an option.

The Chairman recognized Hillside Ave resident Heather. Heather

expressed that the School Committee consider additional options such as the Stephen Palmer Building, Dwight Building, Volante, the conservation area across from Hillside owned by Petrini Corp.

The Chairman recognized Wayne Road resident, Marvin Berkowitz. Mr. Berkowitz stated that his group is concerned about the location of a school on Cricket Field and would like to work with the School Committee to develop an alternative location. Mr. Berkowitz stated that the Park and Recreation Commission have great concerns about putting a school on Cricket Field. Mr. Berkowitz stated that Cricket Field is extremely crowed during sporting events, pointing out that placing a school at this location would exacerbate the problem.

The Chairman recognized Nehoiden Street resident, Ann Keegan. Ms. Keegan expressed her appreciation to the School Committee for their kind and thoughtful nature that went into this task. Ms. Keegan stated that it is her hope that this project continues to move forward as is, adding that to have options taken off the table at this point is not in the best interest of the students.

The Chairman recognized Williams Street resident, Alan Osheroff. Mr. Osheroff expressed that he is a Needham resident that has voted for every override for the schools, adding the his children graduated from Needham and has gone on to have great careers. Mr. Osheroff stated that one of the reasons why he moved to Needham 23 years ago was because of the beautiful field at the end of his street. Mr. Osheroff expressed that Cricket Field should be kept as open space for the good of Needham.

The Chairman recognized Wayne Road resident, Sharon Serinsky. Ms. Serinsky expressed that she has great concerns about putting a school on Cricket Field because of safety issues. Ms. Serinsky expressed that with each soccer or lacrosse tournament there is no space for cars coming in and out. Ms. Serinsky stated that going forward she hopes there will be a feasibility study on traffic patterns. Ms. Serinsky stated that she believes in neighborhood schools but having a school right on her doorstep is not a good option.

Ms. Black stated that the School Committee has received numerous emails on both sides of this issue and that the School Committee realizes how important this issue is to the Hillside School community and Needham residents. Ms. Black stated that the final pre-feasibility study is due to the School Committee the end of June and will be available on line at www.needham.kl2.ma.us. Ms. Black stated that there would be language added, in the Executive Summary, which indicates the position of the Park and Recreation Commission as well as a reference to email and feedback from Needham citizens. Ms. Black stated that at the July 10 School Committee meeting a discussion would take place on the motion made by the Park and Recreation Commission. Ms. Black encouraged continued input by signing up to the Superintendents Listserv at www.needham.kl2.ma.us.

DICUSSION ITEMS

Newman Project Update

Dr. Gutekanst introduced this item. Dr. Gutekanst stated that after a year of repairs and renovations, the Newman Elementary School is preparing for a final push to remove the modular classrooms, complete site work, and open as scheduled in the Fall. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the YMCA has been a huge partner with the Needham Public Schools and the Newman Elementary School. Dr. Gutekanst added that YMCA sent a team of volunteers to run multiple stations on physical health and wellness while the

teachers finished with packing their classrooms. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the Newman School campus would be closed until July 9th and that the administrative offices will be located at the Eliot School. Dr. Gutekanst added that there would be an open house as well as a Homecoming event, at a time to be determined. Dr. Gutekanst expressed his appreciation to everyone involved in supporting this process.

Ms. Black expressed appreciation to members of the PPBC as well as the architects, contractors, and the project management team. Ms. Black added that this project required more preplanning and ongoing planning than any of the other construction projects that the town has undertaking. Ms. Black also thanked Consigli Construction Co., for their generous contribution for the installation of the playground equipment this fall. Discussion followed.

Curriculum Update: Common Core

Dr. Gutekanst introduced this item. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the School Committee has requested of the Superintendent periodic curriculum updates. Dr. Gutekanst stated that Terry Duggan would share information about the implementation of the *Common Core* State Standards in the Needham Public Schools.

Dr. Duggan' presentation included an overview on what the Common Core State Standards are, key instructional shifts that will be occurring because of the Common Core, PARCC Consortium, current district efforts, and upcoming changes for science & ELL.

Dr. Duggan presentation began with a viewing of a You Tube Video titled, "Common Core State Standards: A New Foundation for Student Success." Dr. Duggan explained that Standards define the common knowledge and skills students must acquire in each subject, provide the basis for developing curriculum, provide the basis for developing assessments to measure student progress, and have been in place in Massachusetts for two decades. Dr. Duggan pointed out that the reason for the Common Core is that every state has its own set of standards its own set of assessments and that comparing student performance across states has been difficult. Dr. Duggan stated that 45 states, the District of Columbia and two territories have adopted the Common Core, noting that Massachusetts adopted the Common Core in June 2011. Dr. Duggan stated that when a state adopts the Common Core they have to adopt 100% and can add on up to 15% more in additional options. Dr. Duggan also noted that Massachusetts adopted the Common Core with 15% more in additional options.

Dr. Duggan presented a summary on the Common Core for English Language Arts Literacy and Mathematics as well as its design and organization. Dr. Duggan also summarized key instructional shifts for both English Language Arts and Mathematics. Dr. Duggan stated that along with the Common Core, two consortiums were formed: Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium and PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers). Dr. Duggan stated that states joined one or the other of these two consortiums of whom are charged with developing the next round of assessments, adding that both organizations are working in parallel and would be connecting with each other to make sure all states have a similar measurement for student performance. Dr. Duggan summarized the PARCC Model Content Frameworks. Dr. Duggan pointed out a guide has been produced to help parents understand the Common Core State Standards and to see what students should be experiencing at each of the grade levels. Dr. Duggan stated that this information is available at the Parent Teacher Association (PTA) website.

Dr. Duggan outlined the PARCC Assessment system, noting that this

is the next-generation in K-12 assessment system in ELA/literacy and mathematics. Dr. Duggan stated that the PARCC Assessment is scheduled for adoption in Massachusetts in 2014-2015 only, if the PARCC Assessment is as good or better than the MCAS. Dr. Duggan explained that the PARCC Assessment is a suite of tools to support teaching and learning, focuses on measuring whether students are on track for college/career readiness and will leverage use of technology. Dr. Duggan stated that diagnostic assessments will be available to teachers for use throughout the year, and there will be mid-year, end of the year and computer based assessment. Dr. Duggan stated that common comparable scores would be received in a timely manner across member states. Dr. Duggan presented a time line on the PARCC Assessment as well as an outline on activities within the district that ensures alignment with the Common Core State Standards.

Dr. Duggan stated that the Science Standards drafts are currently available for public comment and a new set of Standards for English Language Learner (ELL) are now in the final stages of development. Discussion followed.

2011-2012 District Goals Year End Update

2011-2012 District Goals Year End Update

Dr. Gutekanst led the discussion on this item. Dr. Gutekanst noted that the School Committee has a status report on the 2011-2012 district goals in their packet for review and questions. Dr. Gutekanst prefaced the discussion by outlining the organization of the status report, noting that a checkmark (\checkmark) in the status column means completed but work may continue on this item; a bullet () means the work is ongoing or in progress; an open bullet (o) means the work will be deferred to next year. Dr. Gutekanst pointed out that of the 58 action items in the plan, 27 (46.5%) are completed; 29 (50%) are in progress; and 2 (3.4%) are deferred.

Dr. Gutekanst presented an update on Action Steps for District Goal #1: Advance Standards Based Learning, Objective 1. Dr. Gutekanst stated that curriculum mapping is complete and published on the web, the Foreign Language program review has been completed and a report is scheduled for October 2012, the revised human sexuality program has been implemented, the Think Math program has been implemented in grades 1-5 and will be implemented next year in grade K. Dr, Gutekanst added that under District Goal #1, Objective 2, per recommendations from the Special Education Program Review, all hiring of Special Education Coordinators, Directors, and Assistant Directors of the Special Education program Prek-8 has been completed. Dr. Gutekanst added that under District Goal #1, Objective 5, and under the leadership of the Director of Human Resources, the mini observation pilot has been completed at Hillside and High Rock and survey data indicates the model is highly favorable with both administrators and teachers.

Dr. Gutekanst presented an update on Action Steps for District Goal #2: Develop the social, emotional, and wellness skills of all students, Objective 1. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the Director of Student Development and the SEL Committee have met frequently during the year and have organized activities prek-12 for staff as well as transition activities between the middle schools and the high school, which have been the focus of the principals and special education directors this year. Dr. Gutekanst stated that a middle school parenting conferences was held in November and other conferences are scheduled for the fall.

Dr. Gutekanst presented an update on Action Steps for District Goal #3: Promote Active Citizenship, Objective #1. Dr. Gutekanst stated that each school has implemented a service-learning project that involves both service to the community as well as reflection

and learning. Dr. Gutekanst stated that many projects are

Dr, Gutekanst added that under District Goal #3, Objective 2 in an effort to establish support structures for students of color, affinity groups have been established at High Rock and Pollard, programs have been established at the high school to increase the number of students who are involved in higher level math/calculus participation and the Needham Steps Up program mentors 7 students with socioeconomically challenged backgrounds. Dr. Gutekanst stated documents and translation services are in place to assist English Language Learners (ELL) and their families. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the District Leadership Team (DLT) has completed their last section of how to be a culturally responsive district and what it means to students, staff and families. Dr. Gutekanst reported on progress with the STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) initiative, and summarized activities associated with this initiative.

Dr. Gutekanst presented an updated on Action Steps for District Goal #4: Ensure Infrastructure Supports District Values and Learning Goals, Objective 1. Dr. Gutekanst stated that a preliminary pre-feasibility study of Hillside and Mitchell schools is complete a final report will be distributed and discussed this summer. Dr. Gutekanst added that under District Goal #4, Objective 2, a special education information system has been procured and implemented, which would provide the district with a multifunctional information system for managing student Individualized Education Plans (IEPs). Dr. Gutekanst stated that online information management systems and online payment systems have been implemented. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the Administrator Compensation Study Committee and the Teacher Compensation Study Committee have met to discuss compensation models and will continue to meet in the 2012-2013 school year.

Dr. Gutekanst noted that the activities that are taking place align with the district goals, which are base on the district's core values. Dr. Gutekanst stated that he is pleased with the work of the district and his appreciative of the support of the School Committee. Discussion followed. The 2011-2012 District Goals Year End Update is available online at www.needham.kl2.ma.us.

 $\frac{\text{FY13 Revolving Funds Budget Requests}}{\text{Dr. Gutekanst introduced this item.}} \text{Dr. Gutekanst stated that Anne}$ Gulati, Director of Financial Operations would present a report on the FY13 Revolving Fund budget requests. Dr. Gutekanst stated that the School Committee would be asked to vote on these requests at the July 10th meeting.

Ms. Gulati began with a summary on what revolving funds are. Ms. Gulati explained that revolving funds are accounts for extracurricular activities and voluntary programs, for which participation is contingent upon paying a fee. Ms. Gulati added that each fund has its own limitations and restrictions, imposed by statute and that the funds are limited to the purpose for which the funds were raised. Ms. Gulati pointed out that with the exception of the Transportation Fund, revolving fund budgets are not required, but that Needham budgets revolving funds for the purpose of ensuring transparency and accountability. Ms. Gulati also pointed out that fee amounts are set by the legislative body

Ms. Gulati stated that Needham operates 47 revolving fund programs. Ms. Gulati stated that revolving fund programs provide extracurricular enrichment activities for students, private music instruction, services for students, learning opportunities for adults, replacement of lost/damaged materials and income for school facilities.

Ms. Gulati present information on revolving funds for which there are program changes or fee increase/decrease. Ms. Gulati outlined FY13 Revolving Funds Budget Requests Needham School Committee -6- June 19, 2012

program changes for preschool. Ms. Gulati stated that there is no fee increase to the athletics program, but some of the fund balance would be used to improve a number of fields in town. Ms. Gulati stated that there is a \$20 fee increase for the Transportation Revolving Fund as well as an increase in the amount of subsidy that the operating budget is providing to the transportation program. Ms. Gulati stated that the High Rock overnight program is being discontinued for FY13. Ms. Gulati stated that the Food Service Program would have a name change in FY13, which will coincide with the Federal and State changes relative to increases in nutrition requirements for school lunch programs. Ms. Gulati stated that there is a fee increase proposed for private music instruction. Ms. Gulati stated that the Science Center is proposing a new revolving fund to provide extracurricular activities. Ms. Gulati stated that there is a small increase proposed for the production center and the book/equipment revolving fund. Ms. Gulati stated there is a proposal to change the non-resident tuition program fees. Discussion followed.

Item Description:	In December 2009, a Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued for the lease of five off-site classroom spaces for the Kindergarten After School Enrichment Program ("KASE"), for the period of August 1, 2010 and expiring on July 31, 2011, with two one-year extension options.
	Proposals were received from only one bidder: the Congregational Church of Needham. The contract was awarded to the Congregational Church in the amount of \$36,276 for the period August 1, 2010 to July 31, 2011. This contract price was based on a rental rate of \$12/s.f., for 3,023 square feet of space. The contract included an option to lease a sixth classroom for an additional \$3,696 per year. Needham Public Schools exercised the sixth classroom option prior to the initial lease term. The rental rates for the optional renewal years are the same as for the initial contract year.
	On July 12, 2011, the Lease Agreement was extended for the first of two allowable extension years, through August 31, 2012. At this time, we seek authorization to extend the lease for the second and last of the two optional extension years, through August 31, 2013.
	As required by M.G.L. Chapter 30B, before a district may exercise an option to extend a contract, the procurement officer must conduct a reasonable investigation of the costs and benefits, and determine in writing that the exercise of this option is more advantageous than alternate means of procuring comparable services. The District has solicited price and availability information for similar space. Of the vendors who replied, none had adequate space available to meet the KASE program needs. As such, we conclude that the exercise of this option is more advantageous than issuing an new RFP for the classroom space.
Recommendation/Options:	That the Needham School Committee extend the contract with the Congregational Church of Needham, for the second and last of the two optional renewal years beginning August 1, 2012 and ending July 31, 2013, at \$39,972, including the exercise of the sixth classroom option.

The FY12 budget reflects the May 2011 Town Meeting appropriation of \$48,436,371, plus cumulative budget transfers made since the beginning of the fiscal year. (A listing of the budget transfers made during the fourth quarter is included as Attachment A.) In prior years, the amended budget also included encumbrances rolled forward from the preceding fiscal year. Since FY05, however, these 'prior-year encumbrances' have been segregated to a separate fund within the Town's accounting system, and are not included in the operating budget. A summary of prior-year encumbrance activity is presented below.

As of June 30, the regular School Operating Budget was 96.7% expended, compared to an overall (weighted) target ratio of 99%. Approximately 97.6% of the appropriated salary budget has been spent to date, compared to a target rate of 98.8%. Three payrolls remain to post, including the supplemental teacher payroll and the weekly and biweekly payrolls of 7/6, which are accrued 100% back to FY12. The purchase of service accounts are 87.3% expended and the expense accounts are 107.3% expended, compared to a target rate of 100%. Capital outlay reflects unbudgeted expenditures on school copiers and a special education van.

In addition to year-to-date expenditures, funds have been encumbered to purchase an additional \$0.7 million in anticipated goods and services. (An encumbrance is a 'reservation' of budget funds, which have been set aside to pay anticipated expenditures.) When these additional encumbrances are added to year-to-date expenditures, the overall 'expenditure' rate climbs to 98.2% of total budgeted funds.

Attachment B presents year-to-date expenditure, encumbrance and target rate information for all school operating budget line items.

Based on year to date expenditures and projected remaining payrolls for FY12, we anticipate that the school operating budget will be 97.9% expended by the end of the fiscal year, leaving a preliminary ending balance of \$1,038,052. This balance is in excess of the \$708,225 ending balance projected at the end of the Third Quarter for two reasons: the state has published its final FY12 Circuit Breaker reimbursements and has awarded Needham an additional \$245,964 in Circuit Breaker revenues; and we have realized \$83,363 in net additional budget savings, largely due to unexpended professional development funds and salary savings from hourly workers. The additional Circuit Breaker revenues reflect a 68.71% reimbursement rate, compared to the previous current year rate of 65%. The higher rate also represents an increase in the amount of the state's \$213 million current year Circuit Breaker budget that was used to satisfy state-wide claims from 90.8% to 99.7%.

As mentioned in previous reports, this larger than usual residual balance includes three components: savings resulting from the pre-purchase of FY12 SPED tuitions (from FY11 budget funds), additional Circuit Breaker reimbursements received this year in excess of budget and savings from employee turnover in FY12. These residual funds are largely committed to the pre-purchase of special education tuitions in FY12, for the purpose of freeing up funds in the FY13 budget to cover the following planned expenditures: 3.68 FTE unbudgeted enrollment teachers and special education support positions (\$184,505) and approximately \$240,000 newly identified special education tuition expenses in excess of budget. In addition, \$350,000 is reserved to provide for additional special education contingency in FY13 and \$172,920 is reserved to provide for the other funding priorities identified on the June 14, 2012 End of Year Expenditure Planning memo to the School Committee. It is anticipated that approximately \$90,000 may remain, which would be returned to the Town's General Fund balance. This balance, could be more or less, depending on actual expenditure postings.

Previously, it had been thought that the \$350,000 in SPED contingency funds might be needed to cover a potential deficit in the Circuit Breaker rate for FY13, based on early information from the Department of Elementary and Special Education that the rate would be between 55-60%, which was less than Needham's 65% budgeted amount. However, the House and Senate Conference Committee's budget recommendation for FY13 allocates \$242 million to Circuit Breaker reimbursements in FY13, which represents an increase of \$28 million (13.5%) over House 2. These additional funds, when combined with the 99.7% effective disbursement

rate for the current year, has caused the Business Office to improve its projected reimbursement rate for FY13 to between 70-75%, thereby eliminating the need to hold back funds to cover a projected Circuit Breaker deficit.

At the end of the fourth quarter, \$1,219,012 (80.3%) of all prior-year encumbrances had been spent on goods and services, and \$299,863 (19.7%) in unused encumbrances had been liquidated. There are no remaining open prior-year encumbrances.

Grants, Donations & Revolving Funds:

Needham also receives revenue from state, federal and local grants, donations and school-sponsored fee-based programs. These funds are received outside of the regular school operating budget in so-called 'Special Revenue Funds.' A summary of the preliminary fourth quarter balances in these accounts is presented below:

During FY12, Needham received approximately \$4.7 million in new federal, state and local grants, of which 84.3 % have been expended or encumbered. Since the federal grant period generally extends through August 31, expenditure activity will continue throughout the remainder of this fiscal year and into the summer to provide for special education student needs, professional development and curriculum planning events for teachers. The FY12 federal grants include \$508,281 in federal Education Jobs ("Ed. Jobs") funds, which represent the final allocation of federal stimulus funds to Needham.

Needham Public Schools also receives gifts and donations. To date, \$95,735 has been given by PTC's, other organizations and private individuals to support instruction and co-curricular activities at the various schools. Needham also receives 'in kind' donations of goods and services, the value of which is not reflected in the above amount. Since donation accounts are 'rolling' accounts, any unexpended funds at year-end will roll forward to FY13 as available revenue.

Finally, the School Department operates several fee-based programs. These programs, which include Food Services, Athletics and Community Education, are mostly self-sustaining; program expenses are paid from user fees charged to program participants. (The operating budget funds a portion of the athletics, transportation and

preschool program budgets.) The fees are deposited in separate special revenue accounts, called "revolving accounts." As in the case of donation accounts, the unspent fee revenues in these revolving funds will roll forward to FY13 as available revenue. To date, \$5.5 million in user fees have been collected to support these programs.

A report summarizing FY12 year-to-date expenditure activity in school grant, donation and revolving accounts is presented as Attachment C.

Trust & Agency Accounts:

The School Department also has access to several investment accounts, which are held in trust for a specific purpose, or on behalf of another party. The Town's Trust Fund Commissioners are responsible for investing and managing the accounts, which are used to provide scholarships for students or to support operations. The School Department also acts as Fiscal Agent for monies collected by students in support of their own activities. These student activity funds do not belong to the School Department, but rather belong to the students. Trust and agency accounts exist outside of the regular school operating budget in separate, specialized accounts. A summary of the fourth quarter balances in these accounts is presented below:

The current book value of the school trust funds (including scholarships and awards) is \$3.2 million. Since the beginning of the fiscal year, donors have contributed \$952,141 to support scholarship activity at Needham High School. These donations reflect a very large gift of \$842,278 to establish the William Sweet Memorial Scholarship at Needham High School. FY12 scholarship and award payments to seniors total \$117,300 and will be paid in July, 2012. The current balance in the student activity accounts is \$240,469, which reflects total fundraising by students of \$817,008 and expenditures to date of \$827,062.

A report summarizing FY12 fourth quarter expenditure activity in the school trust and agency accounts is presented as Attachment D.

School Replacement Capital Funds:

Expenditure activity in school cash capital accounts is presented in the chart below. The chart includes only those projects for which funds have been appropriated to the School Committee. The Town-wide Permanent Public Building Committee (PPBC) manages school construction projects. The Town-wide Public Facilities Department oversees all school facility maintenance and repair projects. The Parks and Recreation Department manages all projects involving school play fields and outdoor athletic sites.
